What is the overall <u>deductible</u> ?		If you have other family members on the <u>plan</u> , each family member must meet their own individual <u>deductible</u> until the total amount of <u>deductible</u> expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family <u>deductible</u> . <u>Deductible</u> exceptions include office visit <u>copays</u> and for federally required <u>preventive services</u> . The <u>deductible</u> starts over with each plan year beginning on January 1 <sup>st</sup> .
Are there services covered before you meet your <u>deductible</u> ?	you meet your <u>deductible</u> .	This <u>plan</u> covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the <u>deductible</u> amount. But a <u>copayment</u> or <u>coinsurance</u> may apply. The <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> is the most you could pay during a coverage period (usually one year) for your share of the cost of covered services. This limit helps you plan for health care expenses. The federal <u>maximum out-of-pocket</u> is \$9,100 individual/\$18,200 family. This applies to all essential health benefits, including services not included in the <u>out-of-pocket limit</u> .
