As of 3/1/2021, Availity will become the preferred EDI vendor for Quartz Health Solutions, Inc. for 837 claim transactions. Availity will also support other standard transactions including 270/271 Eligibility and Benefits, 276/277 Claim Status, and 835 Electronic Remittance Advice. Availity is committed to working with trading partners to ensure there is no disruption in the transmission of your Quartz Health Solutions, Inc. 837 claim transactions. For this reason, we'd like to share important information regarding your electronic claim submission, eligibility status verification, electronic remittance advice, and claim status verification.

Important Information:

Quartz Health Solutions, Inc. and Availity will continue to communicate with you about the transition to Availity.

If you are not submitting claims to Availity today and would like to avoid any possible disruption, work with Availity to ensure connection prior to 3/1/2021. There will be a disconnection and disruption in claim processing if you do not update to submit through Availity.

The existing Payer IDs – 39180, 66705, and 46571 – are not changing. These IDs can be used now and after 3/1/2021 for sending 837 claim transactions.
